AAC Attends 100th Anniversary of the South Cooking Lake Community League

Cooking Lake Community celebrates 100 years of history and adventure. Canada's oldest operating public airport celebrated nine decades of aviation on Saturday, August 19. The volunteer-run airport was founded in 1926 by some of the country's first bush pilots.

Today, Cooking Lake Airport is the oldest operating public airport in Canada, the fifth busiest community airport in Alberta, and one of only 5 CBSA approved international (CANPASS) airports in the province.
